Trauma Recovery Program

If you are a Catholic adult struggling with issues as a result of childhood abuse or neglect, the Trauma Recovery Program will give you specific skills for your healing process. The Trauma Recovery Program explains why the effects of childhood trauma go so deep and teaches skills for living more effectively in the present. This is done without rehashing the hurtful events of the past. The work is done in small groups facilitated by mental health professionals and a priest. The Program is a gift of the diocese at no cost to participants. From the Office of Liturgy and Music

The Second Vatican Council also restored the ancient Order of the Permanent Deacon. Before the Council, all Deacons were Transitional, that is, this Major Order was only conferred as a step to the priesthood. While priests could function in the liturgical role of the Deacon for Solemn High Mass, deacons did not remain so for very long! Concerning the Permanent Diaconate, the Introduction to the Rite of Ordination describes Deacons as strengthened by the grace of the sacrament so that they may "serve the People of God in the *diakonia* of liturgy, word, and charity, in communion with the Bishop and his presbyterate" (no. 5, quoting *Lumen Gentium*, no. 29). They administer Baptism, assist at and bless marriages, "protect and distribute the Eucharist... bring Viaticum to the dying," exercise the ministry of the Word, "preside over the prayer and worship of the faithful, administer sacramentals, and officiate at funeral and burial rites" (no. 174). The Introduction tells them to "be mindful of the admonition of Saint Polycarp: 'Be merciful and zealous, walking according to the truth of the Lord, who made himself the minister of all'" (no. 174, quoting *Lumen Gentium*, no. 29). The deacon models his ministry on Christ's, "who did not come to be served but to serve" (Mk 10:45).

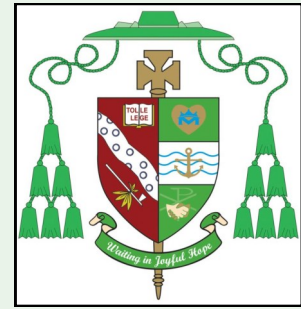
St. Augustine Food Pantry
